Introduction



- Centre for Integrated Community Development (CICD-Uganda) a Non Profit and Non Government organization working with partners organized Buhweju Ecotourism and Cultural Initiative (BETCI) launch that happened on Friday 24th March 2023 at Bihanga Playground, Buhweju West Constituency, Buhweju District.
- The initiative aimed at contributing to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 10, 11, 13 and 15.
- Uganda is endowed with natural and cultural resources and through local tourism,
 Uganda has a better advantage to protect its rich biodiversity and cultural heritage.
- Buhweju district is unique with natural assets and untapped tourism potential. For example, river Waterfalls, food and other cultural heritage sites such as Buhweju Kingdom.
- There is existence of products, sites and information about Buhweju district that is not yet well documented and used for tourism purposes.
- CICD-UGANDA recognizes the global and national conservation efforts and tourism sector in Buhweju will contribute to SDGs and change the lives of people in Buhweju, conserve environment and transform communities.

About Buhweju District



- Buhweju district was curved from Bushenyi district in July 2010. Buhweju District is bordered by Rubirizi District to the West and North West (separated by Kastyoha-Kitomi forest reserve), Ibanda District to the North East, Mbarara District to the East, Sheema District to the South East, and Bushenyi District to the South West.
- Nsiika, the location of the district headquarters, is approximately 53 kilometers (33 mi), by road,
 North West of Mbarara, the largest city in Ankole Sub-region.
- Buhweju district is approximately 310 kilometers (190 mi), by road, South West of Kampala, the capital of Uganda.
- The population of Buhweju is estimated to be 143,800 people according to the Uganda Bureau of Statistics (UBOS Report, 2018).
- 80% of the topography in Buhweju district is hilly and mountainous with U and V shaped valleys.





History of Buhweju

- According to ancient history, Buhweju evolved as a legendary kingdom under a subterranean King Muramira of Bashambo Clan around the 4th and 5th Century.
- The Bachwezi dynasty was dominant in Buhweju and to-date many families still venerate Bachwezi with majority of them having mini shrines in their homes. Items or regalia associated with Bachwezi can be found in some rocky caves in hills known as enyanga z'amabare and these are also tourist attractions.
- According to history three (3) brothers, Rugo, Kinyonyi and Kateizi with their sister Iremeera aboard an eagle which carried them across Buhweju to Bunyoro Kitara in King Ndahura's Palace.
- Kateizi (Brother to Kinyonyi) remained behind in Kagorogoro in Bihanga Buhweju where he founded the Bateizi clan with the tortem "Ente ngoobe"





Buhweju History Continued

- Later on, Bunyoro Kitara King Ndahura married sister Iremeera giving Buhweju Kingdom to Kinyonyi and Buzimba kingdom to Rugo Kinyonyi goes down to Buhweju and kills King Muramira as he emerged out his tunnels at Bukiro establishing the Bariisa rule with their drum "MASHAIJA" around the 9th century.
- The Bariisa ruled Buhweju through 10 Generation up to 12th July, 1901 when the British colonizers killed King Ndagara.
- Buhweju is a kingdowas incorporated into the British Ankole protectorate in 1901. It was ruled by an Omugabe, which is often translated as "king of kings".
- The last hereditary Omugabe was Daudi Ndibarema 1901-1967 ("ex-Kangaho"). His father, Omugabe (King) Mugimba Ndagara III, was shot dead on 12 July 1901 at his palace at Kishungwe, Buhweju by a British colonial expedition commander Lt. Lacy.
- Buhweju fell under the British and Nkole King Kahaya. Buhweju was reduced to a hereditary county until the 1967 constitution which abolished hereditary rule in Uganda. It is important as Banyabuhweju we appreciate and celebrate this background that forms the cream of our history that makes us unique for Tourism.
- Buhweju King's Tunnel: The Omugabe's escape tunnel routes were dug from Bisya–Kyakangire through Mushasha to Rubindi, Kashari in Mbarara City. Another ran from the foothills of Kyamujumi-Kasharara, opening through Bukiro, also in Kashari in Mbarara. The king would use these escape tunnels whenever he sensed danger.
- Lastly, Buhweju is endowed with minerals, gold taking the first place. According to historical sources, Buhweju goldfield was first discovered in 1933, but mining began a year later. The business was, however, interrupted by the Second World War and the subsequent independence struggle of 1962.





How Buhweju is Known

- Buhweju District is a new district curved out of Greater Bushenyi in 2010 and the headquarters are located at Nsiika Town Council.
- Buhweju Kingdom History and Cultural Sites such as Buhweju Kingdom.
- Buhweju being hilly with V and U shaped valleys
- Gold, lime, stones and rocks and other minerals in different locations.
- Buhweju Tea Factories such as Igara Tea Factory that makes a contribution to foreign exchange for the country on world market.
- Fertile soils suitable for cash crops such as tea and coffee and food crops such as millet, cassava, matooke, peas, beans, irish, waragi and local brew, passion fruits peas and beans etc.
- Natural Forest Kasyoha Kitomi Forest Reserve separating Buhweju and Rubirizi district.

What is not Known About Buhweju District

- Kasyoha Kitomi Forest Reserve with unique features Bird watching, Baboons, Monkeys, indigenous tree species, hot spring s, butterflies, birds, primates trail, gold etc.
- Murrum road from Nsiika Bihanga, through Kasyoha Kitomi Forest Reserve to Kyambura connecting to Queen Elizabeth National Park with a road through connecting to Kyambura in Rubirizi district.
- Natural Water Reservour at Katerera- Rubengye, Birds, Monkeys in Nzizi Forest Sector, Tropical rain Forest canopy at Mushojwa in Kasyoha Kitomi Forest reserve.
- Source of River Rwizi in Rwomushojwa and Ruceeri villages. River Mukazi-Anyara, kanyara, Kanyara
 Nyungu and Ndurumo water falls, River Kyonyo and Buhindagi contributing to waters in Lake George and
 Kazinga channel. River Kijojo in Engaju Kyenjogyera Waterfalls in Bistya. Most Rivers originating from
 Buhweju help neighbouring districts such as Mbarara, Ibanda, Sheema, Bushenyi and Rubirizi.
- Buhweju cultural sites with rich fascinating history like Kishungwe, Kagorogoro, Kasharara, Kyamujuni all suitable for establishing community museum.
- Plateaus and Mountains with Spectacular view points to such as Runengo View sites, Kyamahungu, Nyakitaraka, , Kashambya with a view to Mt. Rwenzori, Kazinga Channel, Lake Edward and George, Queen Elizabeth National Park, neigbouring districts.
- Ebinyungu Byamugasha in Kyaniika, Ekitooma Kyomugabe, in Mpanga, Rwenkuba in Kako and Kengyeya.
- Abacwezi caves in Nyakahita owa Kabyemera, Gamiramira cultural site, Eibare Ryengwe Kibarya, Eibare Ryomuntu site, Kashambya, Kengyeya Rocks and Caves, etc.
- NRM War Historical Monument at Bistya Primary school, Security Tunnel near Firing Range in the Swamp Below Bistya., Buhweju Kingdom Kings security Tunnels etc.
- Faith Based Tourism such as Christianity in Buhweju(Butaare and Nsiika), cultural and traditional beliefs and practices that existed before Christianity.
- Agro-tourism opportunities. Prominent farmers in Matooke, tea, coffee, apples, pineapples, etc.



Buhweju Major Challenges



- Poor roads especially central government roads connecting to neighbouring districts and Buhweju inter community access roads are not well maintained.
- Limited access to sustainable markets for farmers.
- Limited schools and poor performance of learners.
- Less value addition and agro-industrialisation of cash ad food crops.
- Limited access to clean water for homes and Institutions such as schools etc.
- Poor telecommunication network in some locations.
- Inadequate and poor access to health facilities in the community.
- Environmental degradation due to human activities such as gold mining.
- Limited access to hydro electricity.
- Less and no existence Technical and Tertiary Institutions operating in the district.



Buhweju Ecotourism and cultural Initiative Objectives



- To mobilize and unite people, recognizing diversity, culture and exchange ideas for stimulating inclusive development.
- To celebrate and recognize the uniqueness of Buhweju and unveil tourism potential
- To raise awareness on environment conservation initiatives aimed at protecting endangered species.
- To link and network with strategic partners in environment conservation, community tourism and culture promotion.



Expected Outcomes



- Increased visibility of Buhweju tourism sites and community cultural initiatives.
- Annual Buhweju Eco-tourism and Cultural Festival/ Ishaazi rye Entunguka ya Buhweju launched in Buhweju district.
- Buhweju district profiled as a tourism destination.
- Initiated and strengthened partnerships, collaboration and linkages with local, regional, national and international partners in ecotourism, community based and agro-tourism, environmental conservation, culture promotion and rural development.
- Knowledge sharing and peer learning among community members on cultural and tourism products development and marketing.





- Most roads in Buhweju are impassable and there need for the Government of Uganda to heavily invest in upgrading major roads connecting Buhweju to neighbouring districts. Most sites are not easily accessible and need road construction, regularly maintain and if possible consider them under tourism roads at a national level.
- Need to document the Buhweju community tour sites and profiling each site with unique history.
- The private sector to interest and be directly involved in development of tourism in Buhweju district.
- Need for heavy investment in resource mobilisation to finance Buhweju Ecotourism and Cultural Initiative activities championed by CICD-U. This needs collective effort and networking with tourism sector players .



Recommendations



- Ensuring Buhweju sites are well documented with factual history. This
 needs heavy investment in documentaries and profiling.
- Continue to organise Annual Buhweju ecotourism Festival. Other Mini Community Based Tourism activities can be arranged to market the Buhweju. CICD-U to continue organising regular eco-tourism events in Buhweju District.
- Lobbying and advocacy to Government for Buhweju roads to be considered as tourism roads connecting to neighbouring districts.
- Follow up with promises made by Minister of Tourism and stakeholders at the event.
- Engage strategic partners especially Buhweju Local government and stakeholders to embrace and support Community Based Tourism in all possible ways.
- Benchmarking on Tourism especially at Queen Elizabeth National Park and ensuring there is training of Community Tour Guides(CTGs).
